#### FREE & REDUCED LUNCH

Families who qualify for free/reduced meals generate a proportionate share of government funds (such as Title 1) for our school. The free/reduced meal application is confidential. We highly encourage your family to complete the application and return it to the school office if you qualify (see income chart information). Families who qualified for free or reduced lunches last year have one month to re-apply before their status is changed and they are charged for lunches.

## **NWEA MAP GROWTH**

Fall Testing Dates: August 19th - September 6th

All students will complete NWEA MAPS Testing during our Fall testing window. Taken three times a year, MAP Growth is an assessment for measuring achievement and growth in K–12 math, reading, language usage, and science. It provides teachers with accurate, actionable evidence to help inform instructional strategies regardless of how far students are above or below grade level. These tests assist teachers in planning individualized



instruction. It also empowers our school staff as they continue to work to improve all educational outcomes. Individual results will be shared at our October conferences. Please be sure your children get plenty of sleep and have a good breakfast.

## ADMINISTRATION OF ALL MEDICATION

All prescription and <u>non-prescription (over-the-counter)</u> medications require written authorization from the student's health care provider (licensed to prescribe the medication) as well as written parental consent for the office to dispense.

Administration of Medication Policy

If your child requires staff to administer inhalers, medicine, including any <u>other-the-counter</u> <u>medicines</u>, please complete the <u>School Medication Authorization Form</u> and return to the school office with their medication.

## **TUITION INFORMATION**

### Using 529 to Pay K-12 Private School Tuition

A 529 college savings plan is a qualified tuition program, sponsored by a state or state agency, designed to allow families a tax- advantaged way to save for college. In recent years, the State of Illinois has allowed parents to use this tax savings for K-12 tuition.

Even if a parent doesn't plan to use a 529 for tax-free growth feature, they can put their tuition payment into the 529, wait the 10 business days, and then take it back out to pay tuition. This will get them a state income tax deduction just for doing this extra step before (or after as order doesn't matter) paying their tuition.

This is a cost free feature and allows you a tax break!

#### IESA SPORTS PHYSICALS REQUIRED – 5th – 8th students

ALL students in 5th - 8th grades participating in sports must turn in a sports physical prior to the season start date. The \$45.00 athletic fee per sport should also be paid as soon as invoiced in your FACTS account.

The Fall Semester sports this year are Cross Country, Golf, Softball, and Girls' Basketball.

- 1) Cross Country, Golf, and Softball sports physicals should have been turned already.
- 2) Girls' Basketball sports physicals must be turned into the school office on or before *Friday, September 6th*.

The Winter Semester sports are Cheerleading and Boys Basketball.

3) Boys Basketball/Cheerleading sports physicals must be turned into the school office on or before *Monday, October 21st*.

## GIRLS' BASKETBALL - signups due by Friday, September 6th

Girls' Basketball is open to all 5th, 6th, 7th & 8th grade girls and registration MUST be completed by *Friday, September 6th* via the St. Vincent de Paul website for Athletics. 
